SUPPORTIVE SERVICES: MORE THAN FOOD

Emergency supplies are not a long-term solution for the more complex challenges that bring customers to us. In 2022, we began enhancing our supportive services.

We learn each individual's situation and provide tailored one-time or ongoing support and tools to help them achieve financial and emotional independence.



- 30 families navigate the application process for governmental assistance programs, including SNAP (food stamps) and LIHEAP (utility bill relief).
- 108 families find additional resources (including mental health services) at other community organizations.
- 29 families build skills through health, nutrition, job readiness and financial literacy classes.
- 479 families receive other, individualized support services.



The Virtual Food Pantry, launched in 2021, makes it easier for people facing tough times to make ends meet by ordering free groceries online. More than 3,106 orders were filled in 2022.






