MORE THAN FOOD


Emergency supplies are not a long-term solution for the more complex challenges that bring customers to us. In 2022, we began enhancing our supportive services.

We learn each individual's situation and provide tailored one-time or ongoing support and tools to help them achieve financial and emotional independence.


THIS YEAR, WE HELPED:

- 30 families navigate the application process for governmental assistance programs, including SNAP (food stamps) and LIHEAP (utility bill relief).
- **108 families** find additional resources (including mental health services) at other community organizations.
- 29 families build skills through health, nutrition, job readiness and financial literacy classes.
- **479 families** receive other, individualized support services.




